INTRODUCTION

This guide contains all the information you need to understand the VETDSS program at Hester Hornbrook Academy and will help you to make appropriate and interesting VETDSS selections.

OBJECTIVES

- Deliver VET Programs that Engage, Equip, Empower and Extend students
- Provide VET Units of competency to assist students achieve their VCE (Vocational Major) Certificate
- Provide an opportunity for students to complete a Certificate II Qualification (full or partial qualification depending on course and duration of enrolment)
- Develop student's employment capabilities
- Develop strong links to industry and jobs
- Develop strong links to positive pathways

QUICK OVERVIEW OF THE VETDSS PROGRAM:

- All VCE-VM students at Hester Hornbrook Academy MUST engage in the VETDSS Program and select a VET offering.
- If you have already completed a VETDSS Program at another school we will add those credits to your report
- VPC students are exempt from the VETDSS Program - unless they have completed the 2 year Propel program
- All internal VETDSS programs are either full or partial qualifications designed to get students the required VETDSS credits to meet the requirements of the VCE-VM
- Classes will run on Campus



WHAT IS VETDSS?

VETDSS stands for Vocational Education and Training Delivered to School Students.

VET courses are created with strong links to industry to give students the skills required for entry level roles in the workforce, or to continue with further education.

HOW DOES VETDSS RELATE TO MY STUDIES AT HESTER HORNBOOK ACADEMY?

VETDSS links directly to the VCE VM (Vocational Major). It is a condition of your enrolment into the VCE VM that you are enrolled into a VET program as part of your studies - **VCE VM Engage Youth (EY) enrolments are exempt from a VET selection.**

Accredited Courses can only be delivered by a Registered Training Organisation (RTO). We utilise the services of external RTO's to ensure that the courses we deliver are nationally accredited and meet industry training standards.

Why VETDSS?

VET courses give you a head start in preparing you for work or further education. Vocational Education and Training has a strong reputation for preparing students with real skills for real careers.

The Vocational Education and Training (VET) delivered to school students (VDSS) core offering is a set of certificates grouped into 12 pathways. Here at Hester Hornbrook Academy, we have a selected range from this offering to support pathways of most interest to our young people.

HOW VETDSS APPLIES TO MY LEARNING

VETDSS is a vital part of your education that is embedded into all VCE VM Pathways.

To successfully complete VCE - VM, students MUST participate in and complete all or some of a VETDSS Certificate. Students work in their VETDSS classes one day per week and earn VET Credits that contribute significantly to their ability to pass their VCE.

VETDSS credits are earned through completing Units of Competence (UOC) which are subjects in every VETDSS Course.


To earn VETDSS Credits, students need to successfully complete the learning and assessment tasks for each UOC - which will earn them VET Points. When students have reached 180 VET Points, they earn 1 UNIT Credit towards their VCE - VM.

ENROLLING IN A VETDSS PROGRAM

To enroll in a VETDSS program at Hester Hornbrook Academy, you need to follow this SIMPLE 4 STEP procedure:



- Please note that new VETDSS Enrolments will be considered at the beginning of each YEAR.
- New students to Hester Hornbrook Academy will enrol in VETDSS programs when they commence with our school.
- YOU CAN ONLY SELECT A VET COURSE OFFERED AT YOUR HOME CAMPUS
- Movement into a VETDSS course will be subject to availability and positive pathway plans.
- The units of competency for each program are listed in this guide. This guide will therefore form the training plan for each student, outlining which units will be taught and assessed throughout the year.

IMPORTANT INFO ABOUT YOUR VET

When you complete your due work, either you or your trainer will upload your work onto Canvas. We will report your completed unit of competency into the VET Student Management System. The school will report your results to the education department and all competed units of competency will appear on your report every Semester.

Your trainer will track your progress as you work through your Certificate and let you know how you are going to get the required VET points you need for your VCE VM. If you have any questions, reach out to your trainer who can give you an update on your progress.

RESULTS AND REPORTS

When providing supports, we consider the assessment tasks and units of competency students are aiming to achieve and any adjustments they may require. We have selected VETDSS programs that we are confident students will be able to achieve within a set time frame.

Students will be supported by the program's Educator, Youth Worker and Education Support Officer as required.

REASONABLE ADJUSTMENT

Students who wish to transfer into a different internal VET program must meet the requirements of a VET change. **Changes to programs are only available at the beginning of each year.** For mid-year changes these must be based on a valid study or pathway reason and following a career conversation with the campus career coordinator. The Leader of VET and Head of Positive Pathways have final approval on all VET program transfers.

Students who wish to attend an external VET program must choose their course carefully with assistance from the careers team. Once a student has started an external VET program, they are unable to transfer into an internal VET course. For more information on external VET please see the appropriate section in this handbook.

COURSE TRANSFERS

Hester Hornbrook Academy is passionate about ensuring we deliver the best courses for our students. If you are not satisfied with the way your training is delivered, you are welcome to report your concerns / feedback to our Leader of VET. As VETDSS courses are nationally recognised qualifications, all VETDSS courses must be designed and overseen by Registered Training Organisations (RTOs) and delivered by highly skilled and qualified teachers or trainers.

So, all the VETDSS courses delivered at Hester Hornbrook Academy are done under the auspice of the Australian Institute of Education and Training AIET (RTO 121314), The College of Sound and Music Production COSAMP (RTO 41549), Ripponlea Institute (RTO 21230), Short Courses Australia (RTO 41261) and are delivered by highly skilled and qualified trainers and teachers, specialising in the delivery and assessment of VETDSS courses.



EXTERNAL VET OPPORTUNITIES

WHY WOULD I DO A AN EXTERNAL VET?

Hester Hornbook Academy prides itself on the wide variety of VET courses it has on offer to our young people. Sometimes however, the VET courses we have don't align best to the positive pathways that some of our young people have identified they wish to pursue once they leave us. There are over 40 VETDSS courses and as a school we can't offer them all, for this reason in some circumstances an external VET course is a better fit



You have a clear idea on your pathway and know that a VETDSS external course is most aligned to that



You have completed work experience aligned to your nominated internal VET program and are ready to start on your pathway journey



You have completed the VETDSS at Hester Hornbrook and want to continue with the next stage of your VET study pathway

HOW IS IT DIFFERENT TO WHAT IS OFFERED AT HESTER HORNBOOK?

Some VETDSS courses are specialist programs which require specific equipment, resources and teachers. As a school we don't have the space or capacity to run all courses. It is for this reason we utilise the external VETDSS program for selected programs and pathways.

External VET programs are run at TAFEs all across Melbourne. The classes are typically filled with other year 11 and 12 students who are also choosing to do this VET program instead of what is offered at their school. External VETDSS runs one day a week. That day is different depending on the course and the TAFE. If your program runs on a normal class day at Hester Hornbrook you will be exempt from attending school that day and be required to go to TAFE instead. The VETDSS day at your campus can then be used for you to catch up on your VCE work. We modify your timetable so that you can commit to both your VCE students and your VETDSS program.

The TAFE provider will advise the Leader of VET each week of your attendance and provides updates on how you are going with your studies.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

- Must be currently enrolled and attending an internal VET program - for at least 1 Semester
- Attendance of both VCE and VET classes must be at least 75% average for the year
- Must have participated in at least 5 days of work experience in the field of interest
- Must have engaged with careers to discuss pathway
- Have BKS levels in Literacy and numeracy of at least 3
- Must be able to independently transport to and from the TAFE provider

COMPLETE THE EXPRESSION OF INTEREST

Applications open in Term 3 each year. You will need to complete the external VETDSS expression of interest form for any interest in an external VET. Your campus careers coordinator will provide you with this form at your meeting. The form needs an endorsement from both your classroom team and your campus careers coordinator.
