

Each year the CAPE team support classroom teams in running practice interviews. We meet so many of our students who ask CAPE for support in applying for casual jobs. The purpose of practice interview is to work on searching for jobs, writing up a resume and cover letter and then preparing to meet with a panel to go through your application. Classroom teams will share the plan for Term 2 when we get back from break.

Australian Universities Accord

Recently, Australia has implemented significant reforms in its higher education sector aimed at improving accessibility, affordability, and quality of education across University. Here are the key highlights of these reforms:

- 1. Cheaper Courses: Some courses, like arts and social sciences, are getting cheaper. That's good news if you're interested in those areas!
- 2.More Help for Important Jobs: The government is giving more money to courses that train people for important jobs like teaching, nursing, and science. It's like a push to get more people into these jobs that Australia really needs.
- **3.Help for Country Campuses**: If you're thinking of studying in the country, there's good news! Country Universities are getting extra help to make sure they're awesome places to study.
- **4. Learning for Work**: Universities are getting better at teaching stuff that will help you get a job. They're focusing on skills that employers want, like teamwork and problem-solving.
- **5.Tech Stuff**: With everything going digital, Universities are using more cool tech stuff to teach. That means more online classes and digital tools to help you learn better.
- **6.Big Ideas**: Aussie Universities are big on finding new ideas and making cool discoveries. They're getting more money to do exciting research and come up with amazing inventions.
- 7. Help When You Need It: Universities are making sure they're there for you when you need help. They're offering more support for things like mental health, study tips, and money advice.

So, if you're thinking about going to on to further study one day, these changes are worth knowing about. Our careers team will keep up to date on the information our young people need to make informed decisions about further (and higher) education if that is their goal.

Every Friday, VCE VM learners take a break from the VCE curriculum and have a go at their VET course of choice from the range we offer here at Hester Hornbrook Academy. What about our "Ready" VET programs?

We know that some of our young people are really keen to work towards employment while they are at school and after they leave instead of further study.

To support this interest and their positive pathways VET also have 2 Semester long (6 month) programs focusing on either Trade or Hospitality. Better known as "Cafe Ready" or "Trade ready" here is snap shot of the course and the units / tickets that students can earn in these 6 month courses:

What is the benefit of completing a VET while at School?

By including VET in their senior secondary program, students develop industry specific and standard knowledge and skills, as well as general skills they need for success in future employment, training, and further education.

Students can select VET that matches their strengths and interests. This means students will have access to more pathways to work and further education.

The CAPE team work with each student to ensure that the VET they select aligns with their skills or interests. We then develop possible future options from this pathway if they wish to pursue further employment or education. The opportunity to participate in VET also allows for learners to try a VET before they commit to further study at TAFE.





Certificate II in Hospitality VET @ Hester Hornbrook Academy

The kitchen was lit this term with our Cert II Hospitality students running their very own in-school cafe.

From table wait staff to drink makers to cooks, the staff and students at our Sunshine Campus have been spoilt with exceptional food and service. All of this for the good cause of practice and application of hospitality and cookery skills as part of the course.



Trade Ready Extended

As part of our work to make pathways more accessible and supported we are pleased to announce a great new partnership in the construction industry sector with Souther Program Alliance (SPA).

The Southern Program Alliance is one of five alliances contracted by Victorian Government to remove 75 of Melbourne's most dangerous and congested level crossings by 2025.

SPA have offered the opportunity to our current Trade Ready VET students from city hub industry tours of 4 sectors of their business including:

- Workplace safety and compliance
- Traffic Management
- Labour Hire
- Environment and Landscaping

These tours will then lead to work experience opportunities for interested and qualified learners (MUST have completed the Trade Ready program to be eligible).

Fiona Sword our City Hub Careers Support is available at any time to speak about this opportunity and other opportunities that are available though SPA.





School Based Apprenticeships (SBAT)

Whilst we offer Certificate II programs as part of our VET, there have been a few of our students over the years who choose to move into the next stage of their learning and venture out into a school based apprenticeship.

One such student is Blake from our VCE VM 3/4 class at our Sunshine campus. Blake completed their Cert II Sport and Rec in 2023 but wanted more. With the support of our industry partner Leisure Employment, Blake is now working towards completing their Certificate III in Sport and Rec. Working at a local Leisure centre as a life quard and swim instructor 8 hours a week and enrolled with Chisolm Institute for their studies. All of this as they continue to complete their VCE while developing their skills and learning in the field of community and emergency services.

Campus careers coordinators can support conversations around what SBAT's are available and the commitments required to participate.



Propel



What is it?

A one-year program where we work on building skills to propel VPC students for:

- Further study preparation for the VCE VM
- Positive Pathways
- Life skills
- Work experience or work

Why?

- The Propel Project is an applied learning class that increases students efficacy to create positive pathways.
